Mount Kilimanjaro

A dormant volcano in Tanzania. It has three volcanic cones: **Kibo, Mawenzi,** and **Shira.**

It is the highest mountain in Africa and the highest single free-standing mountain above sea level in the world: 5,895 metres above sea level and about 4,900 metres above its plateau base.

The Serengeti Wildebeest Migration

The 800 kilometer trek of the immense wildebeest herd is the largest mammal migration on earth.

The timing of the migration coincides with greening of nutritious grasses on the short-grass plains during the wet season.

These areas are safer because predators can be easily spotted making it an ideal place for calving

Cultural **Tourism**

Cultural tours in Tanzania take you to discover the countries diverse heritage. There are 120 tribes in Tanzania and because of that, Tanzania's culture is just as varied as the wildlife in the country.

The fact that these tribes have learnt to live in harmony (at least when you compare with what is happening in some of the neighboring countries) is an achievement that is often understated.

Each of the 120 tribes have their own traditional dances, music, rituals, social practices, art and traditional religious beliefs.



Ngorongoro Crater

Ngorongoro Crater in Tanzania is located in the Ngorongoro Conservation Area which spans across vast expanses of highland plains, savanna woodlands and forests. Established in q959 as a multiple land use area, with wildlife coexisting with semi-nomadic Maasai pastoralists practicing traditional livestock grazing, it includes the spectacular Ngorongoro Crater, the density world's largest caldera.

The property has global importance for biodiversity conservation due to the presence of globally threatened species, the density of wildlife inhabiting the area, and the annual migration of wildebeests, zebra, gazelles and other animals into the north plains.

Balloon Safari

Balloon safari is a fantastic once in a lifetime experience, particularly suitable for a bird's eye-view game viewing experience on your Dare to Travel wildlife tour in northern Tanzania. Hot air balloon rides leave from three sites in this prime national park. In **Central Serengeti**, wildlife gathers year-round in the Seronera River Valley where there is permanent water. The Great Migration passes through around May and June.

The Western Serengeti

includes the Grumeti River. scene of theatrical crossings during the Great Migration in June and July, when hundreds of thousands of gnu, brave the giant Nile crocodiles, and many perish while others detour to avoid the perilous river. In the wildebeests assemble from December onwards, to calve in February, producing 8000 newborn every day on a three-week marathon, a sight not to be missed on your personalized nature travel in Serengeti.

Lake Manyara National Park Tanzania

Lake Manyara National Park well known for the tree climbing lions, the soda ash lake that attracts thousands and pink flamingos, one of Tanzania's biggest elephant population and breathtaking scenery! This travel guide offers you the most updated information about the attractions, Lake Manyara accommodation, getting there and so much more. Enjoy your safari in Tanzania!

There are a number of fascinating tourist attractions that can be explored within Lake Manyara National Park. Located in the northern part of Tanzania, this National Park is 126 kilometers west of Arusha Town. The park is sized 330 square kilometers of which 220 sq kilometers form the lake when the water levels are high in the rainy season. Alternating to the nearest Park of Tarangire National Park through the kwakuchinja corridor the parks share world animals. They can be seen easily nearby the roads towards Lake Manyara and Serengeti National parks.
